'Great Outdoors Taskforce': the future of our forests.

Communities will have a once-in-a-generation opportunity to share their views on the use and care of the 1.8 million hectares of state forests which were previously available for timber harvesting with the appointment of a Great Outdoors Taskforce by the Victorian Government.

The Great Outdoors Taskforce will investigate ways to support more Victorians and visitors to explore the great outdoors, protect biodiversity and create new recreation opportunities. The taskforce will consider opportunities to protect the environment and support recreational, social and commercial opportunities in their recommendations to Government. The taskforce will also explore which areas need to be protected to safeguard threatened species, areas that qualify for protection as National Parks and opportunities for Traditional Owner management.

It will also consider relevant adjacent state forests where assessment of these areas supports a Cultural Landscapes approach for Traditional Owners or will help with management continuity (e.g., to support environmental outcomes or recreation needs).

The taskforce will be established in partnership with Victorian Traditional Owners. Their involvement will be flexible to allow for each Traditional Owner group to determine its involvement.

Former Minister for Environment, Water and Climate Change, Lisa Neville will lead the taskforce which will work alongside the Eminent Panel for Community Engagement.

Members of the Great Outdoors Taskforce will be Karen Cain, current chair of the Eminent Panel for Community Engagement, Mellissa Wood current chair of the Victorian Environmental Assessment Council and member of the EPCE, Graham Dear, Board Chair of the Victorian Fisheries Authority and Terry Robinson, CEO of Destination Gippsland.

Futures Working Group updates

The work of turning ideas into actions has started across the three 'innovation opportunities' that have been prioritised for Nowa Nowa's future by the NN Community Development Group.

Newcomers are welcome to join the working groups, which will meet monthly.

Workshops were held in late April / early May to work on Primary Industry, the Visitor Economy and Nature Tourism. Each workshop considers a question specific to that area.

Primary Industry is looking for answers to "Imagine NN as a place recognised for thriving niche primary producers – what would this look like?"

Visitor Economy is considering "Imagine if NN had innovative food and accommodation businesses enabled 21st century town infrastructure."

Nature Tourism will look for answers to "What would NN look like if visitors were drawn to come and enjoy the nature of Lake Tyers all year round?"

At each workshop we work with the 'assets' in the room: the skills, knowledge, access to materials and buildings, funding, time, networks with organisations and clubs that the people in the room can directly access. For example, each working group starts with the assets of a paid project manager and assistant, access to a school building, seeding funds from Stream 1 of the Local Development Strategy and potential further funds from the Community Development Fund. The skills and networks in the room vary with the attendees: importantly they need to be assets which are immediately available to be used.

Specific ideas for action are then brainstormed based on the assets in the room; ideas are prioritised and finally the idea which has both the most impact and is the easiest to implement becomes the 'Big Easy' project for the group to focus it's immediate actions on.
