What's happening in the transition project?

Over the past two months, we have begun to meet regularly to discuss in detail the opportunities within Primary Industry, the Visitor Economy and Nature Tourism around the Nowa Nowa area. More importantly, we've started to discuss what we want to see happen and **how** we will make them happen.

Accessibility, digital technology within nature tourism, Lake Tyers, wastewater, pub feasibility and the use of the mill site are all part of the discussions being had in the Visitor Economy and Nature Tourism innovation Working Groups in Nowa Nowa over the past couple of weeks. If you'd like to take part in these discussions, we would love to see you! Details below.

Each of the working groups are made up of community members, business owners, Government representatives and researchers. Community members who are interested in future groups are encouraged to take part.

The Nature Tourism Working Group is currently looking at digital techology within nature-based (including history, culture and creative) experiences, accessibility for the area, including around Lake Tyers and the wider Nowa Nowa area.

At the Visitor Economy workshop, the group has identified some key priorities, such as looking at how the mill site could be used, potential innovative wastewater treatments and the feasibility of the pub or other hospitality business in the town.

The initial Primary Industry workshop identified many challenges and opportunities, including biosecurity, plant waste, water, transport and location. These will all continue to be explored further.

Community members from across the Nowa Nowa area are encouraged to attend these working groups to have a say, to ensure their voice and opinion is heard.

Gippsland Lakes Complete Health Supporting Nowa Nowa

Last week, a group of community members met with the GLCH Executive Manager for Clinical and Nursing Services, Cheryl Bush, to talk about sustainable ways to provide more healthcare support to residents at the Nowa Nowa Health Centre.

One of the options discussed, was to provide support to access telehealth (video) via the Health Centre at Nowa Nowa, which could enable people to:

- have their review appointments with specialists without leaving town (dependant on specialist) with or without a nurse present.
- access the Victorian Virtual Emergency Department
- access to other online health services including mental health and allied health.

As we all know, the internet is not great in and around Nowa Nowa, so GLCH are looking into establishing a Starlink connection.

Before deciding whether to progressing with this idea, GLCH has offered to show the community what this all might look like, and provide an opportunity for everyone to ask questions and make suggestions. Dates for this are TBC.





Have you got a 3G phone? You may not be able to use it soon

Mobile network 3G shutdown date has been extended.

The Telstra 3G shutdown date has been extended to 31 August 2024, giving you an extra two months to conduct a health check on your devices to ensure that they are 4G or 5G compatible. Reach out to your service provider or manufacturer to ensure that you stay connected moving forward.

OR you can check if your phone will or won't work by simply SMS'ing '3' to the number 3498.

The following devices may use the 3G network:

- 1. Phones
- 2. Tablets/iPads
- 3. Modems
- 4. Medical devices
- 5. Devices and equipment that extend mobile reception,
- such as antennas
- 6. EFTPOS machines

Managing Pastures Through Dry Times: Multispecies vs Ryegrass

A chance to get out to a field day in Goon Nure to discuss the Mixed Species Project, a joint project between the University of Melbourne and Dairy Australia. This farm is one of eleven dairy farm trial sites across Victoria looking at how multispecies pastures might work to make grazing-based dairy more climate resilient in the southern Australian dairy industry.

The focus will be on pasture resilience, particularly during periods of climate stress, and what this means for home-grown feed supply and pasture management. The group will look at the annual and seasonal pasture production and quality, multispecies compositional changes, and soil health under the two pasture types.

Finish with a farm walk where you will hear from farm owner, Rohan Bingley, on the management of these different pasture types.
