VISITOR ECONOMY

On September 2nd, the group met to address important community issues including hospitality, accommodation, and waste water management.

Hospitality Survey respondents expressed a strong desire for a venue that is cozy, welcoming, and community-oriented, combining casual and rustic elements with a modern flair. The feedback highlighted the need for a versatile, inviting space that appeals to both families and individuals, with a focus on fostering a sense of community, offering high-quality food, and providing a comfortable atmosphere. This will be continued to be looked into as a trial at the Community Hall.

PRIMARY INDUSTRY

Last meeting was held 22nd of Aug, with discussion around excess produce and what are the opportunities using our natural environment (such as venison). Large scale farms can grow for excess, but smaller scale can not, so we discussed drying and sending away for further production.

We also heard from Snowy River Biltong, who shared their product and business goals. They highlighted a growing demand for venison and how tapping into this resource could benefit the economy.

The group is excited about the potential to create a cooperative facility focused on dehydrating food and will continue to explore this opportunity.

NATURE TOURISM

At the meeting on Monday, August 26th, the working group discussed the Augmented Reality (AR) map concept. For now, we decided to trial a paper treasure map over the school holidays as a test. This map could use geo-points or distinct landmarks with trivia, and there will be rewards for completed and returned maps. The group also agreed that training and long-term job opportunities should be a key part of the AR concept moving forward. We're still discussing the boardwalk infrastructure and have also considered hosting a Nature Tourism Forum in Nowa Nowa. This event would support local businesses and entrepreneurs interested in small business and tourism.
